FROM THE BOARD

Hillary Stern

A time for celebration is coming; Rav Jeremy is approaching his 25th anniversary with Temple Bnai Israel! His anniversary will be in August 2025. The Temple has flourished in wonderful ways in the nearly quarter-century of Rav Jeremy's leadership. Our celebrations of Shabbat and holidays have become diverse and creative. Our learning for young and old is meaningful and varied. We've developed ways to care for each other throughout the life cycle. And our tikkun olam ("world-repair") commitments have become broad and deep. State-wide organizations now consider little Temple Bnai Israel in Willimantic an important player to be included at the table, especially on environmental issues.

Those accomplishments and the long bond of our Temple with our rabbi are worth celebrating! They also present an opportunity. We know there are many who will want to honor Rav Jeremy both within our Temple community and in the broader communities of Northeast Connecticut and the Reconstructionist Movement, so our celebration will both honor Rav Jeremy and support the future flourishing of Temple Bnai Israel. If you're interested in helping to plan our celebrations, please let Hillary know.

Rav Jeremy's long tenure at Temple Bnai Israel brings up another topic we'd like you to know about; while his youthful good looks and frequent bursts of youthful joy may have fooled you into thinking he's younger than he actually is, he will turn sixty-four this summer. He has let the Board know that he intends to retire when he's sixty- seven, in the summer of 2027. Congregations with long-serving clergy benefit from a thorough and deliberate planning process for transition to new leadership, so the Board will establish a transition team this summer to begin planning. While transitions can be difficult, we are also excited by the opportunities that change brings. We're grateful to have three years lead time to minimize the difficulties and maximize the opportunities.

RABBINIC REFLECTIONS

Rabbi Jeremy Schwartz



Psalm 126

A Song of Ascents

When the Creating One returned with the return to Zion, we were like dreamers. Then our mouth was filled with laughter, and our tongue with joyful song. Then, among the nations, they said "God has done great things with them." God has done great things with us and we were happy. Return, Adonai, with our return, like watercourses in the Negev. Those who sow with tears shall reap with joy. The one who is walking, walking and crying, carrying the length of the planting, will come, come with joyful song, carrying the sheaves.

Our return to Zion was, indeed, like a dream. Actually, there was incredible hardship, but it was still like a dream. Imagine: Jews living as Jews on their own terms. Not on the Christians' terms or the Muslims'. Not even on the rabbis' terms. Working the land, building. Dreaming of an egalitarian, just, and peaceful society. Reclaiming their ancient language and making it speak modern words. And the nations were amazed! Nina Simone sang "*Eretz Zavat <u>H</u>alav*;" Pete Seeger sang "*Zum gali gali*;" Everyone sang "*Hava Nagilah*" – Let's rejoice!

But there were, and are, tears. Tears caused by war and terrorism, tears of displacement of both Jews and Palestinians. We need God – the PROMISE OF POSSIBILITY, the POWER OF LOVE, the FORCE OF LIBERATION to return with us. Change is hard. Even love and liberation are often costly and hard. It's like the hard work of sowing and tending. There are tears. But with that PROMISE/POWER/FORCE, "those who sow with tears shall reap with joy." Let's keep walking together, carrying one another's burdens, planting, tending, and singing until we're carrying the sheaves.

One possibility: A tsadik is a righteous one, one who practices right living. Another possibility: In Hassidism, the Rebbe, the sect's leader, is also their Tsadik. He is the great connector, finding and gathering the holy sparks of his followers and raising them to their source in God. Or, according to the Psalm for the Sabbath Day: "A tzadik blossoms like a date palm." But what if each of us is a tsadik? What if you're gathering sparks, connecting worlds, blossoming. This week is the period between Passover and Shavuot associated with the aspect of divinity called Tsadik (or Y'sod - Foundation). For our Shabbat service, we'll try that aspect on and blossom a little.
